RABBI'S COLUMN

Transforming Justice Into Compassion

In a world whose rudder lately feels loose often leaving us struggling to find direction, we human beings most often seek two directions: "judgment and attack" and "judgment and forgiveness." Yes, I meant to include the word "judgment" in both cases as in both internal (mental) and external (Life) decision-making, we humans lean on making assessments, judgments, that lead us to certain resulting/accurate conclusions. Or so we think. The real question is, with the rules for assessment/judgment often blurred by our humanity, how do we come to honest conclusions? How do we make the righteous choice to attack versus the righteous choice to forgive?

Our tradition and Jewish Law is clear: We must extend far more — even orders of magnitude more — compassion over justice (attack). Don't get me wrong — Judaism does not speak about turning the other cheek per se. One must protect oneself, that is a commandment, but we must not act vengefully or wantonly to cause damage to others . . . even and especially if we believe that they are doing wrong to us (the Rabbis are even more clear that without being directly or personally affected, we are forbidden from zealously pursuing another's wrong-doing; rebuke is one thing, ensuring punishment of another is something else altogether).

Throughout history, the Rabbis have been focused not so much on how to punish but rather on how to show maximum compassion to others. And it is clear in their writings that this is often in direct substitution to the fulfillment of pure justice. After all, compassion is only compassion if it is the result of sacrificing an accounted measure of justice. And for thousands of years our Sages have lived the understanding that a world without compassion could not stand. The act of granting compassion is a holy act with its own reward unto itself.

As we leave behind the month of Av, during which we recall and mourn many of the major tragedies of the Jewish People, we look to ways to make things right for ourselves and for those around us. Sephardi Jews do not wait to practice this mitzvah, beginning their Selichot on the very first day of the month of Elul. Perhaps if we all set aside an entire month (instead of several days) for both introspection and seeking to offer and receive compassion for errors, we might find the Yamim Noraim, the Days of Awe, an even more powerful and freeing season.

So, as your Rabbi, I challenge you to do that which is less human and more Godly: Give up your judgments that lead to punishments (for yourself and others) and

May we all find measure upon measure of compassion for each small dose of justice, and may we all know that even if our neighbor cannot find such holiness in their heart, God’s love remains to bind our faith and each of us, one to the other, even if when we cannot see it.
