

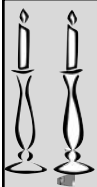

RABBI'S COLUMN

Remembering Hope

As months go, June is one that brings back strong childhood memories of special moments. For residents of our beautiful Brigantine Island, it is a month of plenty — people, food, sun, activities, a sense of freedom that only blue skies can bring, and just plain happiness. Whether young or old, it marks the end of the school year and a newfound focus on recuperating from what has increasingly become an over-programmed life. For most of us, it is certainly a time of fulfilling well-made plans. Whether those plans have to do with travel or repairs to our home or just being able to get outside and connect with family and friends, June signals to most of us that our long-awaited “freedom” is finally to be realized.

In the Jewish calendar, as we conclude the month of Sivan and enter the month of Tammuz, we realize that the Summer is bringing us quickly to the end of the Jewish year. There is a bittersweetness to this portion of the Jewish calendar that reflects the remembrance of many tragic events that befell the Jewish People as well as some positively defining events during this season. Ultimately, however, both June and the months of Sivan and Tammuz, which straddle the month of June this year, bring forth memories of the freedom that good weather brings.

There is something about Summer that brings out the child in all of us. And, I think I know why: There is an inherent excitement and sense of hope connected to this season and to our childhood that cannot be suppressed. Stuck inside and forced to diminish our experiences, Winter weather can leave us feeling hopeless. The month of June, especially on Brigantine Island, brings with it a hope that is child-like and pure, one that can easily become infectious.

Most of us can remember our first Summer vacation from school or when we completed our high school or college educations and began making a living for ourselves. The single most vital characteristic of these experiences for all of us is probably the idea of “hope.” We make plans and we hope for certain outcomes; we work hard and hope that our efforts are rewarded (or at

least acknowledged); we pray for ourselves and others, hoping for only positive news. The recurrent theme, however, is hope; unadulterated and wholeheartedly giddy hope.

While I have always been aware of it intellectually, I have been blessed over the last nearly five years to experience the never-ending hope that children bring into the world. Whether it is the persistent hope of parents as they try to will success for each of their child's endeavors or it is the wide-eyed optimism that displays itself in the 50 requests (or more) for the same forbidden toy or food item or activity, hope is our psyche's 'little engine that could.' Without hope, we do not stand a chance of changing for the better or recognizing the success we often achieve without even noticing it.

Let us remember and sustain within us the power derived from the kind of hope that each of us cultivated and nurtured as a child. Let us ignore the naysayer within us and within our neighbor who can sometimes suppress the hope around us. Instead, let us enthusiastically invite everyone to hope and to dream so courageously as to transform ourselves and the world around us. Regardless, no matter what we hold onto this Summer, let's remember the joy of hope and its incredible power to transform our thoughts and our lives.

May this Summer bring us all the most simple and holy of states: hope. And may we all be blessed to share ours with those whose well has run dry. In so doing, we will be actualizing our hope to make Judaism's and our personal aspiration of a world in greater harmony come true.

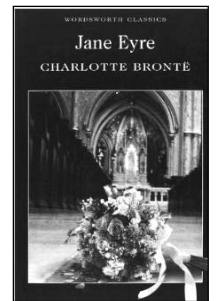

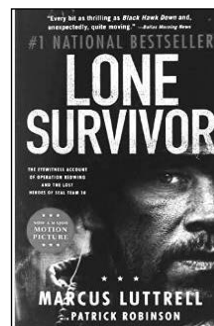

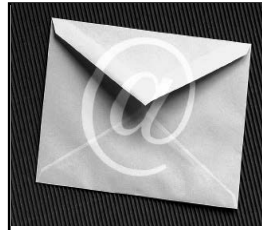
Many new events and new prizes will be available this year along with several new masters of ceremonies.

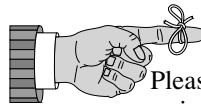
