RABBI'S COLUMN

Yester-You and Tomorrow Too

It is rather simple, really. Every year, when we focus on the truest sense of the season of repentance before us, we reflect on our behavior in the past year. We mull over conversations and even the minutiae of incidental comments; we think about the pain we caused others, whether deserved or not; we dwell on our own suffering and the individuals and situations seemingly responsible for that suffering. The danger of our tradition of introspection is that we can become obsessed with the small, the minute, to the exclusion of our People's ancient message of expansive consciousness of soul connected to soul connected to soul, and so on.

In thinking about the self as something greater than a sum of its parts, of its behaviors and descriptions, I found my mind returning to a book I read at age 14 that helped to unlock my religious imagination. (Note to self: All roads lead back to home.)

In the classic religious adventure, "Autobiography of a Yogi," the author recounts an interaction with his master when he was a young apprentice. The two were discussing the bug bites they'd receive each night while they slept in a guest house. The apprentice, accustomed in his youth to the luxuries of protective gear against both the annoyance and the real danger of insect bites, hints at his need for relief. And it is in that moment of focus on the details of his life that a door is opened: "... the insects were in full residency; I was bitten from head to foot. My guru took pity on me.

'Buy yourself a [insect] curtain, and also one for me.' He laughed and added, 'If you buy only one, for yourself, all mosquitoes will concentrate on me!'"

The message is clear: When we focus on the details of our own life, we can miss the inextricable interconnectedness of Life. All Life. All.

There is a reason that many of the names for God that are found in our holy texts and rise up from our mouths in prayer have an endless quality about them. Connection is, by definition, an endless state. Who we were last year is not just a sum of the behaviors – words and actions – of a certain slice of time. Who we were informs who we are and we cannot help but define who we will be in the coming year without reference to our past.

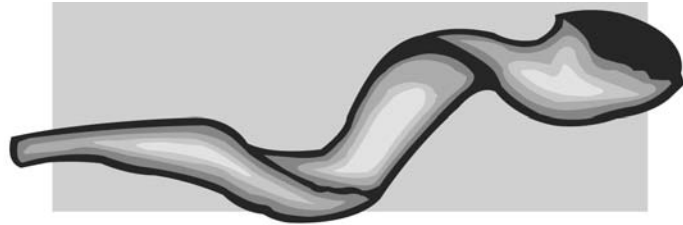

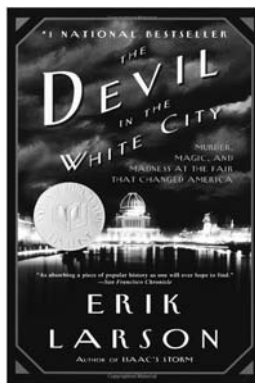

The dots that artistically compose the picture of each of us do not and cannot alone define us.

They are too small for that purpose. We are too big for that purpose. Our ancestors understood and our great Sages taught that anything is possible, we cannot be limited to a definition, to a label. No matter how many people try to make sense of their world by narrowly defining you and your world, pay no heed: Each of us is infinitely bigger than that.

When considering the person – the complete, broad spectrum of a person – you were last year, I offer you a little direction from your Rabbi: Try, try, and try again to envision who you have been, and then imagine again and again who you will be in the year to come and beyond.

Each point on our trajectory to come is no doubt important, but holding onto a complete picture of who we are will always guide us on a true path forward.

Let's face it . . . we are all works in progress. Even if others do not forgive us for this fact, let us resolve to engage in the true self-love of forgiving ourselves in order to transform, to grow, to expand our existence. Each of us has a limited time in this world, so let's focus on what is truly important. Namely, to develop a vision of who we will be by being the best of who we were.

I wish you a *G'mar Hatima Tovah v'Moadim L'Simkha*, a sealing for good and a season of joy – for both Yom Kippur and for Sukkot from me and my family!

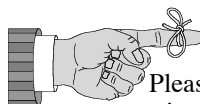
