RABBI'S COLUMN

Parenthood, the All-Powerful, and Patience

As I complete my message to you (I have been thinking about and writing and re-writing this for several weeks), I sit ready to receive my little ones.

"*Mann tracht, Gott lacht!*" Loosely translated: "Man makes his little plans and then God sits back with a bucket of popcorn and laughs!" Fair enough. I know that my wife and I will face many unexpected bumps on this new road unwinding before us. Let's face it — neither she nor I are Spring chickens. Yet, having had our faith and everything else challenged in the many years since we first desired to be parents, we feel that at our age and with our additional life experience, we can truly appreciate the blessings we are about to receive.

So much of the Torah and the entire *TaNakh* (Hebrew Bible) is an ebb and flow of two things often punctuated by their being in apposition: Warnings and the playing out of a reality often different than predicted. Whether king or even God, what is first warned of does not always find fruition in the unfolding narrative of the human lives etched upon our holy scrolls. The message is clear: Life is not a laboratory where you can control variables or outcomes. Life is rather obviously the unending interconnected

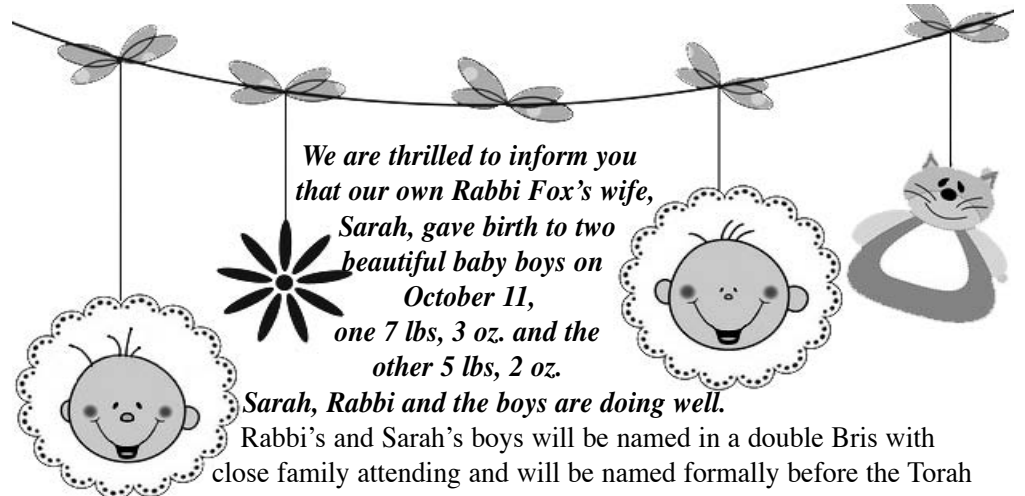

chaos that we seek to tame enough so that we may do more than just survive. Warnings in life are many; outcomes, well, outcomes are far less certain.

And such is the theme of parenthood. We think that we can make the jungle of Life into a groomed English garden, but this is only so if we are truly blessed with a number of factors that only some of us possess. From material wealth to a calm demeanor, from a true moral compass to a safe environment, from good humor to the wealth of a sane family, and so on, our ability to achieve is measured, in part, by many factors that are beyond our control. This does not mean, as Rabbi Tarfon reminds us in Mishnah Avot, that we should cease from trying to bring order to our world, to bringing forth God's holiness. Ultimately, we must remember that we cannot make our world better without each of us trying to follow, at least in some way, a path of righteousness.

There is a Midrash about the words for "man" and "woman:" "Man" is spelled *aleph, yod, shin* – "Eesh;" and "woman" is spelled *aleph, shin, hay* – "Eesha." And one of the most basic words for God is spelled *yod, hay* – "Yah." The Midrash teaches that we must be careful to include God in EVERYTHING that we do, even if it seems odd to do so. If not, and we remove God's holy name from our names, "Eesh" and "Eesha," literally we remove the *yod* and the *hay* from "man" and "woman." In doing so, we are left with the same letters and word for both man" and "woman:" *aleph* and *shin* together, making "Eysh" – "fire." The image, of course, is that this leaves our lives devoid of anything but a formless and tormented flame.

This Midrash is a reminder that parenting – whether we are guiding five-day-olds or fifty-year-olds – works best when we fill our lives with the two most often repeated attributes of God that we are commanded to reflect back into the world: Compassion and patience. Our tradition teaches that without these, no one can survive, no family can survive, and even no congregation can survive. And so, if my becoming a new parent can teach you, my congregants, a single lesson, it would be to increase your compassion and patience.

Take a moment . . . call your children and grandchildren or your nieces and nephews or your found family and listen to them without judgment, offer to help without strings, share your love and your life without expectation. How can you find the energy and willingness to change or enhance your mindset? Join me and your fellow congregants in prayer, in moments of study, and in acts of loving kindness. Your family needs you to be spiritually whole . . . your congregation needs you . . . your People needs you. I look forward to sharing my spiritual transformation and learning as always, but now with a little "smell of baby" on me and in my words.

May each of us be blessed to receive the compassion and patience — the love — we so terribly need in our lives and may we keep God in our lives by granting the same to others willingly.

Here we go!

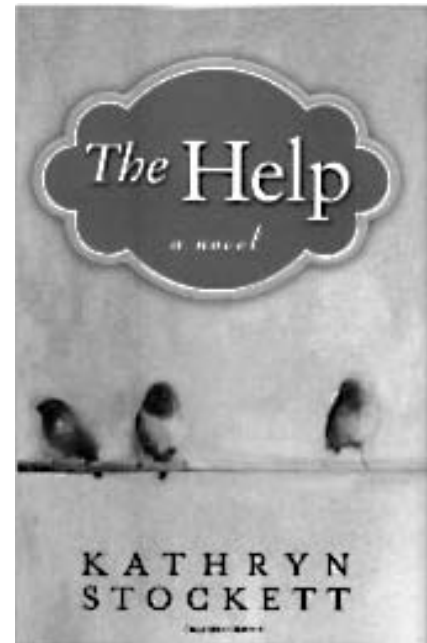

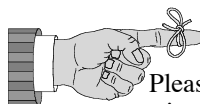
