RABBI'S COLUMN

Living As You Like It

All the world's a stage,

And all the men and women merely players...."

– Shakespeare's "As You Like It," Act II, Scene VII

Many years ago, when I was a child, a family member described the situation of another family member as dire. As a financial planner of sorts, he did whatever he could to leave nothing to chance. He reviewed his notes for the day and made new ones before going to bed. In the morning, he reviewed his plans for the upcoming day, making notes so that he would be able to make the most of his day. And, during the day, at least once or twice, he would reassess his list and notes to maximize his efficiency. When I asked him why he made such an effort to focus on the future, his answer was simple: "It's the simple six P's of success: Proper prior planning prevents poor performance." Perhaps some of you have heard similar phrases, but the truth is that even the best laid plans are only part of the path that leads to a healthy and happy future.

Our heritage teaches that it is extremely important to plan for the future. After all, planning is at the center of so many Jewish religious and cultural observances and, with regard to the more mundane elements of our lives, we cannot sustain one's life without a focus on what our future may hold. And yet, ultimately, planning is not enough. Doing must complement the planning for our future.

Without an ability to live in the moment, to experience life as it is, and to make the best of what we have, we cannot achieve anything meaningful, no matter how much proper prior planning we perfect. Planning and doing are two sides of the same coin; they are inseparable within the human experience. The most common example of this for us is, of course, when we reach the High Holy Days each year and a part of us wonders if the act of repentance is a futile endeavor. Each year, we may ask ourselves — as we apologize for, ask forgiveness for, and make plans to abandon our lesser selves — "Is this a game that is without any redeeming value or any resolution?" If we are lucky, we realize that the purpose of seeking repentance and seeking forgiveness is not to achieve some sort of perfect state but rather to purposefully and persistently mold ourselves and the world around us toward a more perfect and more holy state. The task is not to achieve a certain status but rather to become more perfect by persistently engaging in the act of positive self-transformation.

Ultimately, the secret to a happy life and a life of meaning is not found in the most intricate of plans or in dedicating our waking hours to the doing of busywork but rather developing a vision for the future and following a path toward it. Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur provide us an opportunity to refocus ourselves both on our plans for our future and thereby to allow an adjustment to our trajectory in life. Without these yearly examinations and subsequent adjustments, we would most certainly careen out of control just as we would were we not to adjust the steering wheel of our car on any journey longer than the length of our driveway.

In the end, we may consider ourselves lucky in life, I believe, if we are blessed to see a few "scenic overlooks" during our life's travels so that we might see far enough ahead

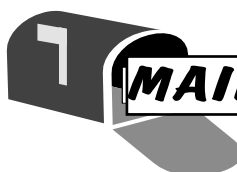


Dear Beth Shalom,

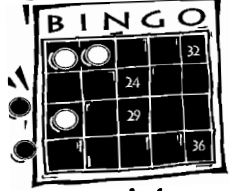

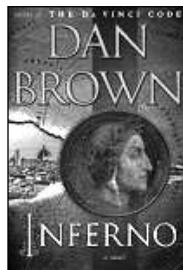

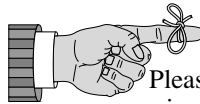
