RABBI'S COLUMN

Get a [Healthy] Life

Summer, especially the month of July, feels for most of us imbued with a sense of abandon, a sense of freedom. We take off time from our normal schedules in order to engage in all kinds of special outdoor activities or, given the heat wave that inevitably hits sometime during the month, special indoor activities, as well.

As Jews, the month of July typically holds for us a sense of communal freedom with the Independence Day holiday at the beginning of the month and for many of us, the latter part of the month brings us a tempered sense of freedom with our remembrance of the breaching of the walls of Jerusalem by the Romans on the 17th of the Jewish month of Tammuz. With that one act, so began three weeks of slaughter of between 600,000 and 1,200,000 Jews, culminating with the destruction of the second Temple on the 9th of the Jewish month of Av. The freedom to live and to worship as we saw fit as a People essentially ended with the second Temple's destruction, forcing the Jewish People to evolve our religious civilization.

For most of us, the battle between the individual and the community is a constant one, just as it has been for our ancestors across hundreds of generations. The entire Jewish ethos is a balancing act between the individual and the community; each of us is obligated to pray, for example, but we may only recite certain prayers when in a community of 10 or more individuals. The purpose of many of our laws and customs have to do with keeping a community culture in place despite the fact that doing so requires that individuals observe the same, or at least similar, practices.

And so it is with us: Each of us makes a choice as to how we engage with the community. Are we small donors of our time and money or do we make large gestures, hoping to make a significant difference in the trajectory of the community? Do we make our will known or do we follow the will of others? Do we participate joyfully or do we do so begrudgingly? Do we

choose to get along or do we encourage disruption? Ultimately, we are often faced with the binary dilemma: Do we join in or do we withdraw? Judaism provides us answers to these difficult questions.

Jewish communities, I was taught long ago and have seen for myself, are coalitions of people willing to explore their spiritual and personal and communal identities. It is only by being open to our own exploration of ourselves that our place in the world around us may grow. Freedom speaks of detachment from the community, while community speaks of the absorption of the individual. In our country of late, there has been a significant emphasis on individual freedom at the expense of the strength of our broader community. For Jews, however, these two seemingly polar opposites must both exist at once in relative balance in order for each of us to live a healthy and fulfilled life.

So, as we climb aboard our boats, go walking along the beach quietly alone, or enjoy the festivals and foods of Summer, let us not forget our communal home and our obligation to build up the Jewish People here in Brigantine and nearby, as well as in the wider Atlantic and Cape May Counties area. Let us commit to giving of ourselves and our time and money to build a congregation that is a beacon of freedom of Jewish spiritual and communal expression. Come to our services and events; greet everyone with a cheerful demeanor, offering our assistance to others; and, yes, give willingly of ourselves AND our financial resources to the upkeep, repair, improvement, and overall greatness of our physical and spiritual expression of our Judaism that we call Temple Beth Shalom.

Let us not forget what our great Sages taught: "Do not separate yourself from the community." We may enjoy our freedom, but that freedom only bears the sweetest fruit when we engage with others as members of a community.
